The Green Star necklace by arteInCasaMia is a 6-pointed star. Perhaps not everyone knows that, in Greek-Latin antiquity, it was believed that the light of Venus came from two distinct planets. In fact, they were referred to by different names: Vespertina, the evening one and Lucifer, the morning one. It was Pythagoras himself who discovered





that, in reality, it was the same planet that was placed before or after the Sun, appearing either at dawn or at sunset depending on its momentary position with respect to the Sun.

The star has different meanings depending on the various contexts and differs according to the number







*of points which can be 4, 5, 6, 7, 8,

*The six-pointed star is also called
the hexagram: it is a very ancient
symbol. The triangle pointing
downwards symbolizes Shakti and
the one pointing upwards Siva. The
mystical union of the two triangles
represents creation.*

*The two triangles together are also
known as 'Shanmukha',
i.e. it is the six-faced, representing
the six faces of Kartikeya,
Siva's progeny*







*and Shakti. Equilateral triangles
interpenetrating.*

*Triangles represent the duality of
the universe: spirit and matter,
masculine and feminine.*

*It is a symbol common to several
religions, such as Judaism, Islam
and even Hinduism.*



*The 6-pointed star, for the Jews
the "Star of David", hexagram
known as the "shield of David" or
also "seal of Solomon" -
together with the
Menorah oil lamp*



with seven branches, it is the symbol that represents Jewish civilization and religiosity. In this specific case the six points of the star symbolize the twelve patriarchs or the twelve tribes.
